TOTAL NUMBER OF IDPS CURRENTLY DISPLACED









All information collected on IDPs and returnees is included in the Emergency Tracking (ET) database once the locations of displacement or return have been identified and validated. The identification of the locations of displacement of the new arrivals requires some time, especially in out-of-camp locations. As some areas are not easily accessible, time is required between an actual population movement and its tracking and reporting.





NUMBER OF DISPLACED INDIVIDUALS IDENTIFIED BY EMERGENCY TRACKING SINCE 17 OCTOBER



As of 15 July:

- Ongoing field visits enabled to identify IDP families in rural areas in Ninewa governorate;
- Hasansham M2 camp recorded an overall increase of 200 IDP families;
- Chamakor camp recorded a decrease of 129 IDP families because of return movements.
