In response to the need for accurate and up-to-date information on human mobility and forced displacement in north-east Nigeria, IOM activated its Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) to support the Government and the humanitarian community with multi-layered data on the status, locations and needs of populations affected by the on-going conflict and communal clashes in north-east Nigeria.

During the assessment period of Round 39 (30 August to 15 October), the DTM has identified a total of 2,182,613 IDPs in 444,781 households across north-east Nigeria. This represents an increase of one per cent (or 17,744 individuals) compared to Round 38.

The DTM has identified an IDP population of 2,200,357 individuals as of 15 October 2021




