

EMERGENCY EVENT TRACKING Data collection: 12 January 2022

The DTM Emergency Event Tracking (EET) is deployed to track sudden displacement and population movements, provide more frequent updates on the scale of displacement, and quantify the affected population when needed. As a subcomponent of the new Mobility Tracking methodology in Sudan (Round Three), and activated on a need basis, EET utilises a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population presence per location - a useful tool for humanitarian response planning and design.

Event Overview




DTM teams activated EET to monitor the displacement of individuals affected by inter-communal violence in Kereneik locality, West Darfur. Clashes erupted on 4 December over a property dispute at a local market involving Arab nomads and Masalit tribe. For more information, please see EET Kereneik (Kereneik town), West Darfur (Update 004). DTM Sudan conducted an inter-agency verification mission on 28 December 2021 alongside numerous humanitarian agencies such as UNHCR, UNICEF, WHO, UNOCHA, UNDP, World Relief, UNFPA, WFP, UNOHCHR, NRC, UNDSS, IAS, CDF, TGH, CONCERN, WCC, ADRA, SORR, and UNDSS among others. The increase in the IDP caseload since the previous update is reflective of field teams gathering data from additional sites in Ardamata IDP camp in Ag Geneina locality, and Morayat village in Kereneik locality, West Darfur.

The fifth EET update estimates a total number of 61,621 individuals (12,158 households) currently seeking shelter in Kereneik town (89%), Um Tajok (7%) and Morayat village (1%) in Kereneik locality, West Darfur, as well as Ardamata IDP camp (3%) in Ag Geneina locality, West Darfur. The IDP caseload was originally displaced from Abuja IDP camp (27%), Hi Alsehrej (16%), Um Dowin (14%), Hi Lima (11%), Hi Abou (7%), Hi Al Mdaris (6%), Hi Al Naser (4%), Dafour village (2%) Hi Al Jabal (1%), as well as other locations (12%) across Kereneik locality, West Darfur.


DTM field teams have confirmed, upon reverification, that at least 67 individuals were killed with a further 78 individuals sustaining injuries. A total of seven individuals report lost goods/livestock and cattle. All displaced individuals are Sudanese nationals. DTM teams identified at least 12,501 cases of additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support. Based on a ranking scale, the three priority needs across the caseload are WASH, Food, and Emergency Shelter.





Return Intention

Data collected through the return intention indicator suggests that all IDPs (100%) intend to remain in the same location.
