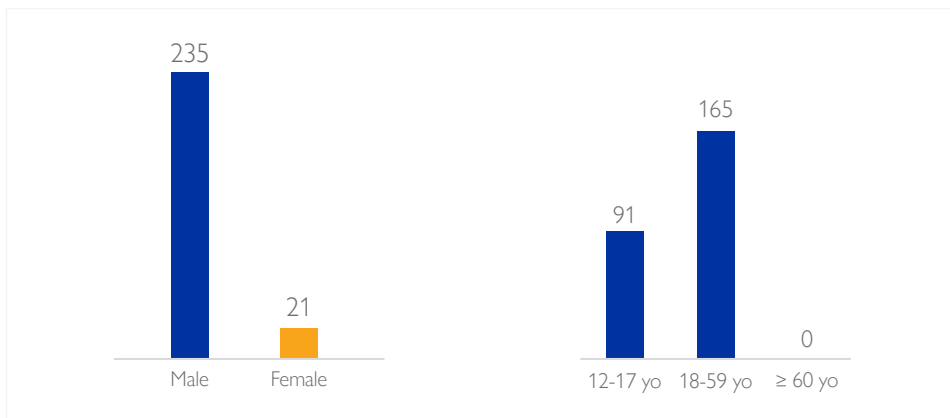

As part of the national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM community mobilizers, accompanied by medical teams vaccinated migrants at Ain Zara detention center (DC).

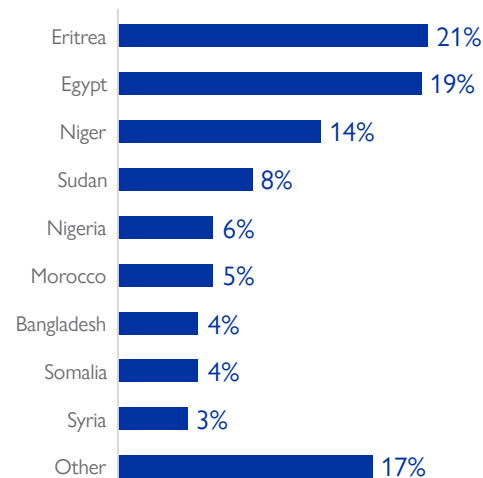
During the eleventh week, 256 migrants (21 females, 235 males) have received Sinopharm vaccines.

The migrants vaccinated were from 38 different countries of origin, including Eritrea (21%), Egypt (19%) and Niger (14%).

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated



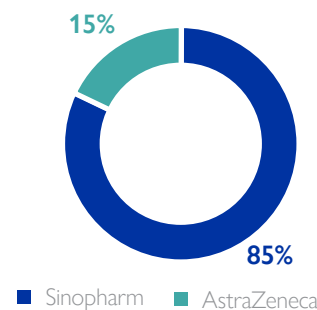

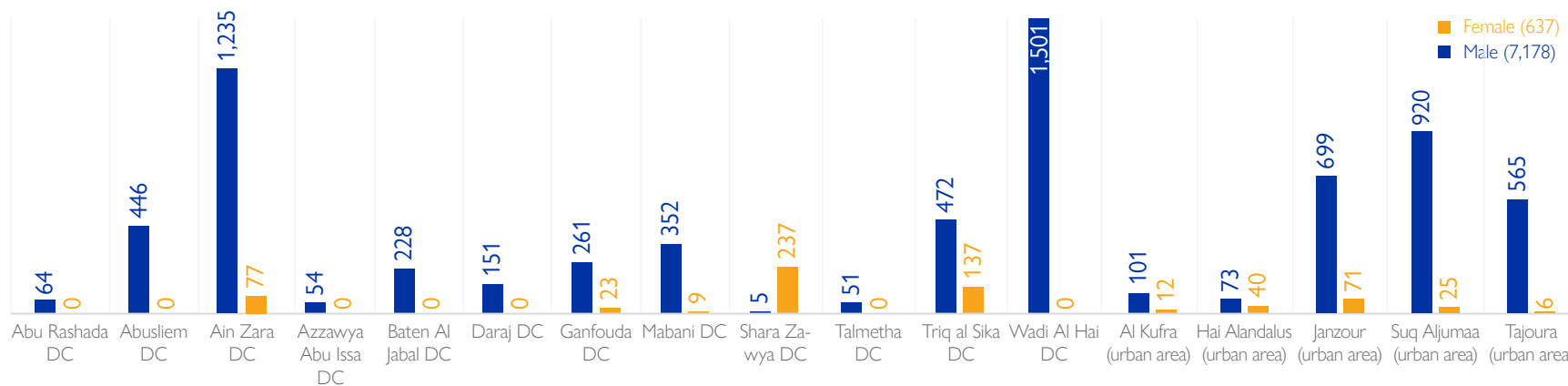

Vaccines provided*



By the end of the eleventh week, a total of 7,815 migrants (637 females and 7,178 males) have received either Sinopharm or AstraZeneca vaccines, out of which, 2,321 migrants (30%) have received two doses and are fully vaccinated (including the migrants who received the first dose before 3 October 2021). Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.
