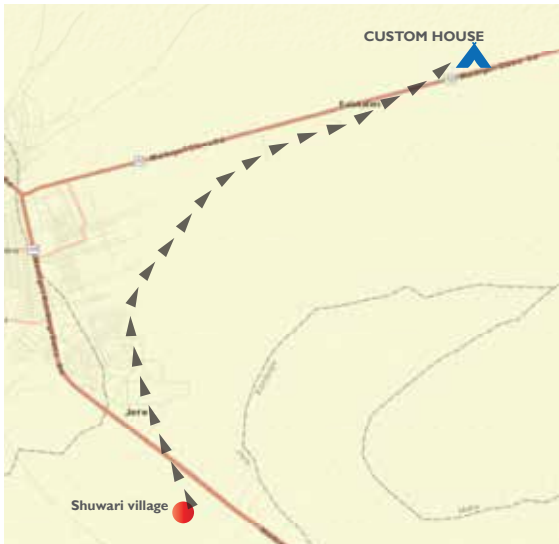

On July 13 2017, an assessment was carried out to ascertain the situation of the new arrivals at custom house which arrived on 12 July 2017. The new arrivals reported to have been camped at a screening point in Shuwari village for over two months which was also reported at that time of their arrival. MSF provided food distribution, plastic sheets, and health intervention during the said period.

SEMA spearheaded the movement of these IDPs from Shuwari to Custom House. Head count was conducted by the newly arrived IDPs Bulama's and the estimated number of household and individuals stood at HH 152 IND 1,391. The newly arrived IDPs are already constructing make-shift shelters with available resources.

They are currently making use of available latrines, water supply, and health services at the location. Meanwhile, water points at the location require reticulation and improvement to be able to contain IDP influx at the location.

MSF is presently conducting food distribution for the new arrivals which will be sustained till the end of the month after which ICRC and IMC will take over.

Presently, new IDP arrivals of about 152 individuals have been recorded at Shuwari village and are undergoing screening, these new arrivals are from various villages in Mafa, Dikawa, and Konduga LGAs.

With these influx of new arrivals, there will be an estimated total number of 7,262 individuals with 1,157 households at Custom House Camp. Based on the assessment conducted today, the resources in the camp will be over stretched. The following are the most urgent needs;

- Shelter
- WASH facilities and
- NFI
