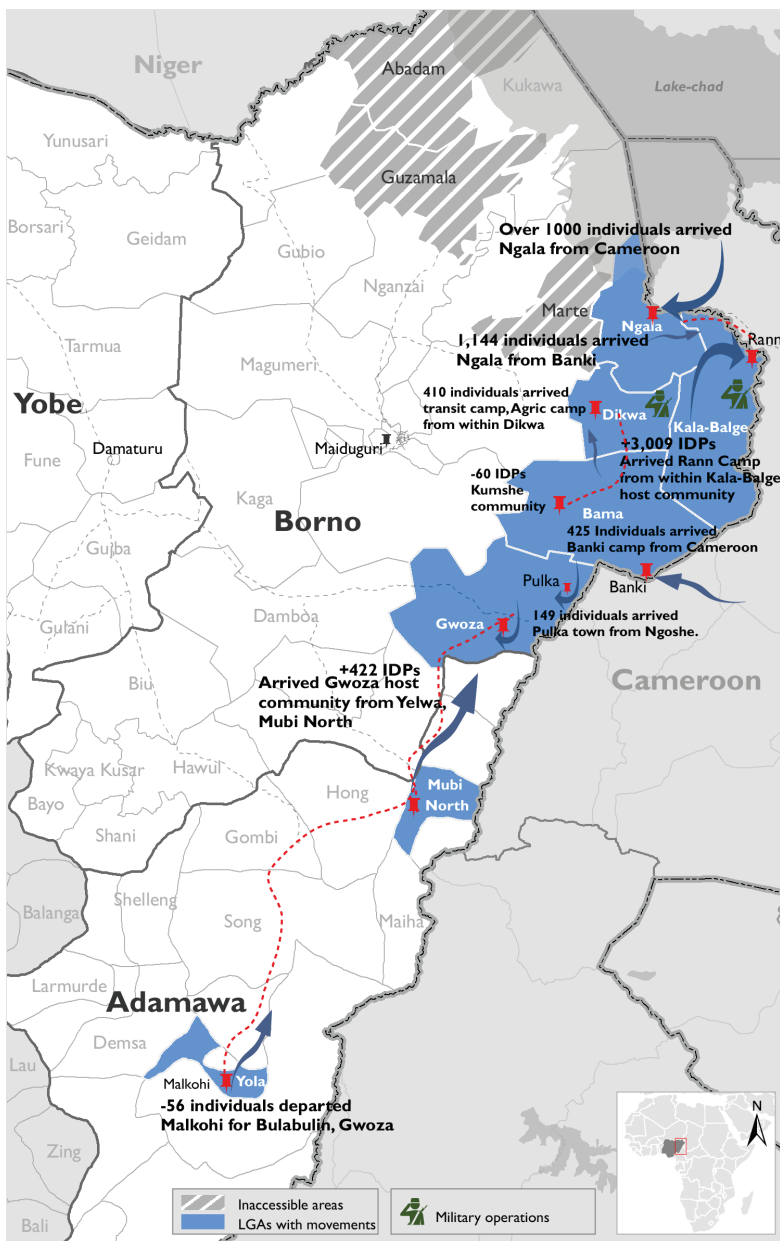


DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX - Nigeria

EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT)

The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and provide up-to-date information on sudden displacement and other population movements

Reporting period: 15 - 21 March 2017



SNAPSHOT: Gwoza, Kala Balge, Bama, Ngala, Dikwa

LGA: Gwoza

15 - 20 March

Location Type: Host Community, Camp
 Hausari/Gadamayo, Ajari, Bulabulin, Wakane Primary School Camp
 20 Housing Unit Camp

Movement: Organized/Spontaneous

645 individuals (128 HH) arrived in Gwoza between March 15 and March 16, 2017.

422 Individuals (106 HH) arrived in Gwoza town from Yelwa in Mubi-North, Adamawa state. (142 Individuals arrived in Hausari/Gadamayo community on March 15, while 174 Individuals arrived on March 16. 106 Individuals arrived in Ajari community on March 15),

56 Individuals (12 HH) arrived Bulabulin/Gwoza Wakane town from Malkohi in Yola-South, Adamawa state and another **14 Individuals (8 HH)** arrived in 20 Housing Unit Camp from Wurojabbe community in Mubi-North, Adamawa state. (Organized movement),

Trigger: Voluntary relocation (Improved security)

4 Individuals (2 HH) arrived in Wakane Primary School Camp from Ngoshe community in Gwoza due to military operations in the area. Also, **149 Individuals** arrived in Pulka town from Ngoshe between the 19 and 20 March, due to military operations around Ngoshe. (Spontaneous movement)

Trigger: Military operations

Urgent needs: Food, Shelter, NFI, and Health

Available services: Food, shelter, NFI, water, sanitation, health and protection (Insufficient)

Returnees: Cumulative figure = 58,089

LGA: Kala Balge

15 - 17 March

Location Type: Camp

Rann Camp,

Movement: Spontaneous

3,070 Individuals (614 HH) arrived at Rann IDP Camp from neighboring communities in Kala Balge and Bajiri community in Ngala. Out of the total number, 1,474 Individuals arrived from neighboring Wauchakale community on March 15, 921 Individuals arrived from Isari community and 614 individuals from Daima community respectively, arrived on March 16. Another 61 Individuals arrived from Bajiri community in Ngala on March 17.

Trigger: Military operations

Urgent needs: Food, Shelter, NFI, Water, Sanitation, Health and Protection

Available services: Shelter, Water, Health and Protection

IDPs: Cumulative figure = 38,733

LGA: Dikwa

17 - 19 March

Location Type: Camp

20 Housing Transit Camp, Agric Camp

Movement: Organized

470 Individuals (93 HH) arrived at Camps in Dikwa from March 17 to March 19. Out of the total number, 60 Individuals (10 HH) arrived at 20 Housing (Transit) Camp from Kumshe community in Bama on March 17. 36 Individuals arrived at Agric Camp from nearby Turuna community on March 18 and 374 Individuals arrived at 20 Housing (Transit) Camp from nearby Zangere community on March 19.

Trigger: Military operations

Urgent needs: Food, Shelter, NFI

Available services: Food, shelter, water, sanitation, health and protection (Insufficient)

IDPs: Cumulative figure = 82,926

LGA: Bama

19 March

Location Type: Camp

Banki Camp

Movement: Organized

425 Individuals (116 HH) arrived at Banki Camp from Tagawa in Cameroon on March 19, with assistance from the military.

Trigger: Military operations

A planned relocation of 423 IDPs from Banki to Bama failed as the truck that was intended to be used broke down. 18/3/2017

Urgent needs: Food, Shelter, NFI, Water, Sanitation, Health and Protection

Available services: Food, Shelter, NFI, Water, Health and Protection

IDPs Cumulative figure = 35,233

LGA: Ngala

19 March

Location Type: Camp

Ngala Camp

Movement: Organized

An estimated number of **2,144 Individuals** arrived in Ngala camp between March 16 and March 19. Out of the total number, 1,144 Individuals arrived in Ngala from Banki on March 16, due to military operations, while over 1,000 individuals arrived at Ngala Camp from Cameroon on Sunday, March 19, with assistance from the military.

Triggers: Military operations

Urgent needs: Food, NFI and Shelter

IDP: Cumulative figure = 33,615

Methodology: The data presented in this report has been collected by DTM staff deployed in the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.
