



425 Individuals (116 HH) arrived at Banki Camp from Tagawa in Cameroon on March 19, with assistance from the military.

Trigger: Military operations

A planned relocation of 423 IDPs from Banki to Bama failed as the truck that was intended to be used broke down. 18/3/2017

Urgent needs: Food, Shelter, NFI, Water, Sanitation, Health and Protection

Available services: Food, Shelter, NFI, Water, Health and Protection

IDPs Cumlative figure = 35,233

An estimated number of 2,144 Individuals arrived in Ngala camp between March 16 and March 19. Out of the total number, 1,144 Individuals arrived in Ngala from Banki on March 16, due to military operations, while over 1,000 individuals arrived at Ngala Camp from Cameroon on Sunday, March 19, with assistance from the military.

645 individuals (128 HH) arrived in Gwoza between March 15 and March 16, 2017.

422 Individuals (106 HH) arrived in Gwoza town from Yelwa in Mubi-North, Adamawa state. (142 Individuals arrived in Hausari/Gadamayo community on March 15, while 174 Individuals arrived on March 16. 106 Individuals arrived in Aiari community on March 15),

56 Individuals (12 HH) arrived Bulabulin/Gwoza Wakane town from Malkohi in Yola-South, Adamawa state and another 14 Individuals (8 HH) arrived in 20 Housing Unit Camp from Wurojabbe community in Mubi-North, Adamawa state. (Organized movement),

Trigger: Voluntary relocation (Improved security)

4 Individuals (2 HH) arrived in Wakane Primary School Camp from Ngoshe community in Gwoza due to military operations in the area. Also, 149 Individuals arrived in Pulka town from Ngoshe between the 19 and 20 March, due to military operations around Ngoshe. (Spontaneous movement)

Available services: Food, shelter, NFI, water, sanitation, health and protection (Insufficient)
