



**● LGA: Chibok** 14 - 16 April, 2017

**12 HH 33 INDS** arrived at Kautikari from Mubi between 14-15 April.

Heavy rains during the week have seriously damaged structures at Red Bricks IDP Camp, many IDPs have moved out of some buildings which have become inhabitable. Further rains will only destroy more buildings, shelter repairs/construction are a major need at the camp.

**Urgent needs: Shelter**

**● LGA: Gwoza** 14 - 15 April, 2017

**Movement: Spontaneous** **Triggers: Improved security**

**285 HH 1,199 INDS:** 239 HH 963 INDS arrived in Gwoza Town from Lamurde, Wurojabe, Daware and Wuropatuje LGAs of Adamawa State. A further 33 HH 130 INDS arrived from Bakassi Camp in Maiduguri. Arrivals occurred on April 14. All new arrivals joined host community. Major needs are Shelter and NFIs.

3 HH 33 INDS arrived in Gwoza Town from NYSC Camp Dware, in Yola, Adamawa State. Another 6 HH 49 INDS arrived from Fori Camp, Maiduguri. 13 INDS were rescued by the military during an operation in Mbita, a location close to Sambissa forest. They are been kept at the screening area for people in the town to identify them before they are allowed into the town. Arrivals occurred on 15 April. Major Needs are food, shelter and NFIs.

**PULKA**  
2 HH 11 INDS were rescued by the military during operations in Mallam Bala and Gobbara Mitta and have been placed at General Hospital Camp Pulka. Major needs are water, food, shelter and NFI. Arrival occurred on 15 April.

**Urgent needs: Food, water, NFI and shelter**

**● LGA: Ngala** 4 - 9 April, 2017

**Movement: Organized** **Triggers: Voluntary relocation**

**45 HH 133 INDS:** 4 HH 13 INDS arrived at International School Camp in Ngala, from Dikwa, due to poor living conditions in their previous location. Major needs are food, shelter and NFI. Arrival occurred on 13 April. Relocation was voluntary.

41 HH 120 INDS arrived at International School Ngala Camp between 15-16 April from Cameroon, Chad and Dikwa. All relocations were voluntary. Major needs are Shelter, NFI and food.

**Urgent needs: NFI, Food, shelter and water**

**● LGA: Kala/Balge** 13 April, 2017

**Movement: Organized** **Trigger: Improved security**

**24 HH 144 INDS** arrived from Mardiya ward and settled in the Host Community.

**Urgent needs: Food, shelter and NFIs**

**● LGA: Bama** 10 - 17 April, 2017

**Movement: Spontaneous** **Trigger: Poor living condition**

**285HH 874 INDS** 77 HH 210 INDS from Kushekushe in Cameroon were brought to Banki by the Cameroonian military. Arrival occurred on 10 April. 50 HH 180 INDS arrived from Minawu in Cameroon, relocation was voluntary. Arrival occurred on 13 April. 132 HH 334 INDS were brought back to Banki by the Cameroonian military on April 15, while another 150 INDS arrived in Banki from Cameroon on April 17.

SEMA carried out a distribution of food items and NFIs at Banki on 15 April, the beneficiaries of the distribution were the new arrivals at the camp.

**● LGA: Askira Uba** 10 - 15 April, 2017

**Movement: Organized** **Trigger: Poor living condition**

**64 HH 143 INDS:** 29 HH 80 INDS returned from Yola North in Adamawa to Askira Uba LGA in Borno state to seek better livelihood opportunities like farming. 35 HH 63 INDS also relocated from Maikadir and Lassa wards in Askira to Kofamaikadir (11 INDS) and Nurthalvu (52 INDS) in Askira Uba, also to seek better livelihood in form of farming.

**Urgent needs: Food, Water and NFI**

**DTM & ETT Cumulative: IDPs = 11,306**

**● LGA: Damboa** 14 - 16 April, 2017

**Movement: Organized** **Trigger: Improved security**

**14 HH 77 INDS:** 4 HH 18 INDS arrived at Ajari Host Community from Zarawayuku ward in Biu due to improved security. Arrival occurred on 16 April.

6 HH 27 INDS arrived from Arah Kunu in Mubi, Adamawa state, at Shuwari Host Community due to improved security. Arrival occurred on 15 April.

4 HH 32 INDS returned to Shuwari Host community from Wuyaram Ward in Damboa due to improved security. Arrival occurred on 16 April.

## ETT Nigeria Glossary

### Type of Movement:

- **Organized:** Planned movements from one location to another, usually with assistance from various actors on ground, such as government, the military, and other humanitarian actors.
- **Spontaneous:** Unplanned movement usually as a result of sudden triggers, such as attacks, conflicts and other situations that pose threat.

### Triggers:

- **Voluntary relocation:** Voluntary movement of persons from one location to another.
- **Involuntary relocation:** Involuntary movement of persons from one location to another, usually due to intervention by other actors, for example, the closure of a camp in a location, requiring IDPs in the location to move to other locations, security reasons, and other prompts.
- **Conflicts/Attacks:** Population movement triggered by security threats in a location.
- **Poor living condition:** Population movement as a result of difficult circumstances and poor access to basic needs, such as, shelter, food, water, livelihood and other needs.
- **Military operations:** Population movements as a result of the arrival of the military to a location requiring civilians to move to other locations, to avoid being caught in between conflict situation that might ensue.
- **Improved security:** Population movement as a result of reduced threat or danger in a location.

**Urgent Needs:** Areas where an affected population require humanitarian assistance to alleviate suffering and improve the chance of survival.

**Available Services:** Humanitarian assistance provided to the affected population in a location to alleviate suffering and improve the chance of survival.
