




The Return Intention Survey in Federal Training Centre Camp (Dalori I) was conducted at a household level between 1 and 2 December 2021. The camp is located in Konduga LGA, Borno State. A total of 441 households responded to the questionnaire, representing a sample of 11 per cent of the total IDP population. They were randomly selected from an estimated 4,088 households that are currently residing in the camp. All households reported that they were displaced as a result of the ongoing insurgency in North-east Nigeria.



LIVELIHOOD

Livelihoods in locations of origin

Petty trade	31%

It is important to note that all respondents in Federal Training Centre Camp reported that their access to livelihood activities was interrupted as a result of their forced displacement. Eighty-nine per cent of IDPs believe that they can resume their livelihood activities upon return to their locations of origin.


DISPLACEMENT HISTORY

LGAs of origin



Year of displacement




The graphic above demonstrates that a significant number of IDPs in Federal Training Centre Camp find themselves in a situation of protracted displacement.

Number of times displaced



The analysis illustrates that a majority of 70 per cent of the IDPs in Federal Training Centre Camp are planning on returning to their locations of origin due to the Government relocation schemes. As a result, a great influx is to be expected in Bama LGA following the closure of Federal Training Centre Camp. It is to be noted that 22 per cent of IDPs do not intend to return to their locations of origin but rather prefer to integrate in the local community around Federal Training Centre Camp. This choice is mainly motivated by the security situation in the LGAs of origin.
