



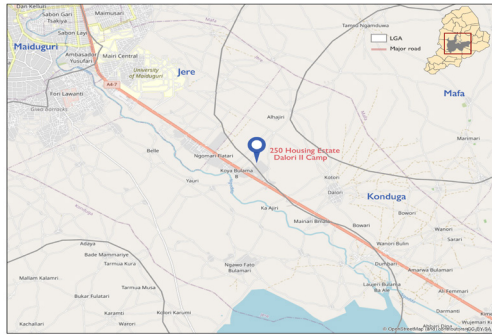

DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX NIGERIA - NORTH-EAST ZONE

RETURN INTENTION SURVEY 250 HOUSING ESTATE (DALORI II) - BORNO

DECEMBER 2021

The Return Intention Survey in 250 Housing Estate Camp (Dalori II) was conducted at a household level between 1 December and 2 December 2021. The camp is located in Konduga LGA in Borno State. A total of 242 households responded to the questionnaire, representing a sample of 9 per cent of the total IDP population. They were randomly selected from an estimated 2,714 households that are currently residing in 250 Housing Estate Camp. All households reported that they were displaced as a result of the on-going insurgency in North-east Nigeria.



LIVELIHOOD

Livelihoods in locations of origin

Agro pastoralism	39%

It is important to note that 98 per cent of the IDPs in 250 Housing Estate Camp reported that their access to livelihood activities was interrupted as a result of their forced displacement. Ninety-two per cent of IDPs believe that they can resume their livelihood activities upon return to their locations of origin.

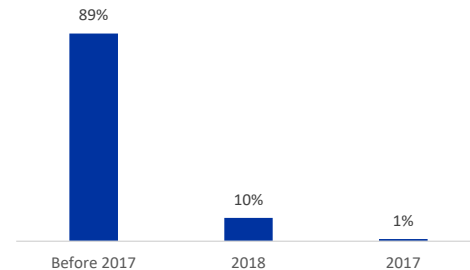
DISPLACEMENT HISTORY

LGAs of origin

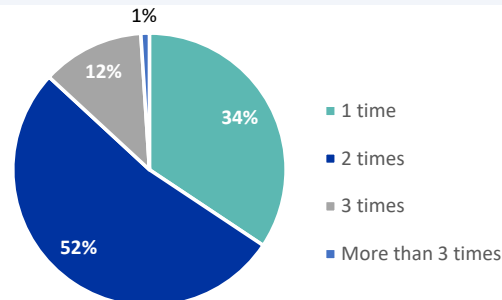

Year of displacement



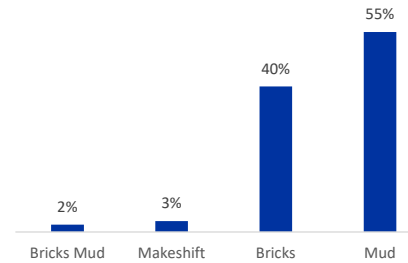
The graphic above demonstrates that a significant number of IDPs in 250 Housing Estate Camp find themselves in a situation of protracted displacement.

Number of times displaced

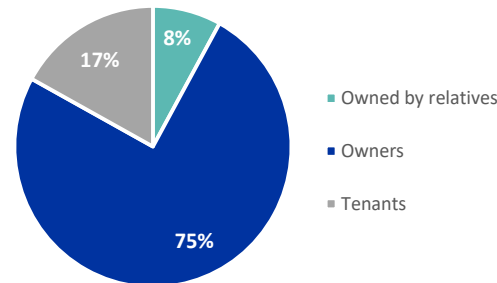

The analysis illustrates that the great majority of IDPs in 250 Housing Camp are planning on returning to their locations of origin as a result of the Government relocation schemes. It is to be noted that only a small minority of 7 per cent of IDPs do not intend to return to their locations of origin but rather prefer to integrate in the local community around 250 Housing Estate Camp. This choice is mainly related to the security situation in the LGAs of origin.
