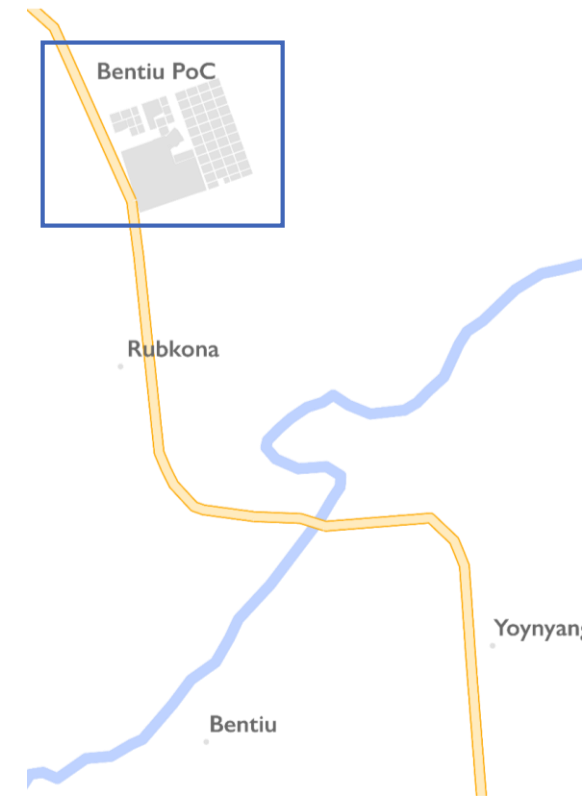
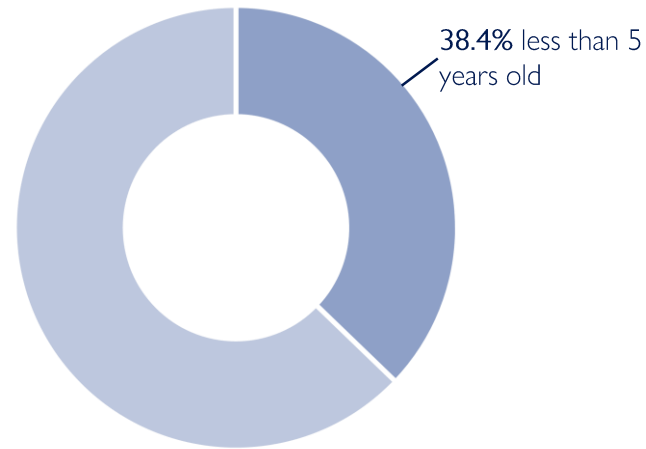
Data collection 26-28 February 2018

The Bentiu Protection of Civilian (PoC) site was established in December 2013. As of February 2019, 159,647 beneficiaries remained registered in the site. However, recognizing that there have been significant population changes since the last biometric registration, IOM-DTM conducts monthly headcounts to monitor changing dynamics and displacement trends.

As per the February 2019 headcount, the population stands at 105,202 individuals (17,848 households). DTM have done a change in checkpoint for more than 1,400 individuals and there will be similar exercise in Rubkona and Guit Counties.

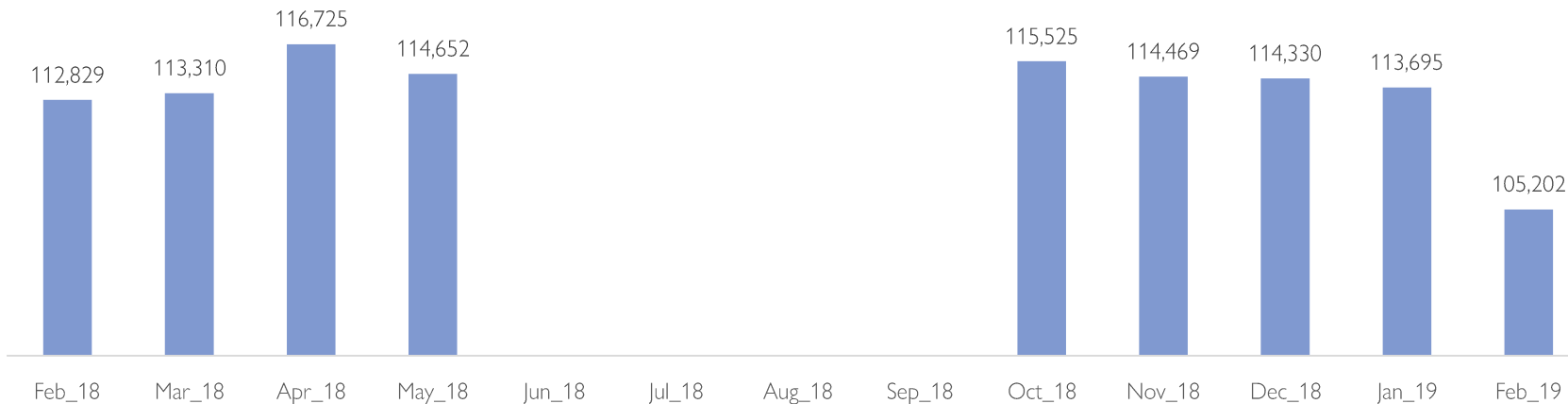
Children under the age of five constitute over 38.4 per cent of the PoC site population. Overall, 49.7 per cent of the population are male and 50.3 per cent are female.

Monthly trend in Bentiu PoC, February 2018 – February 2019

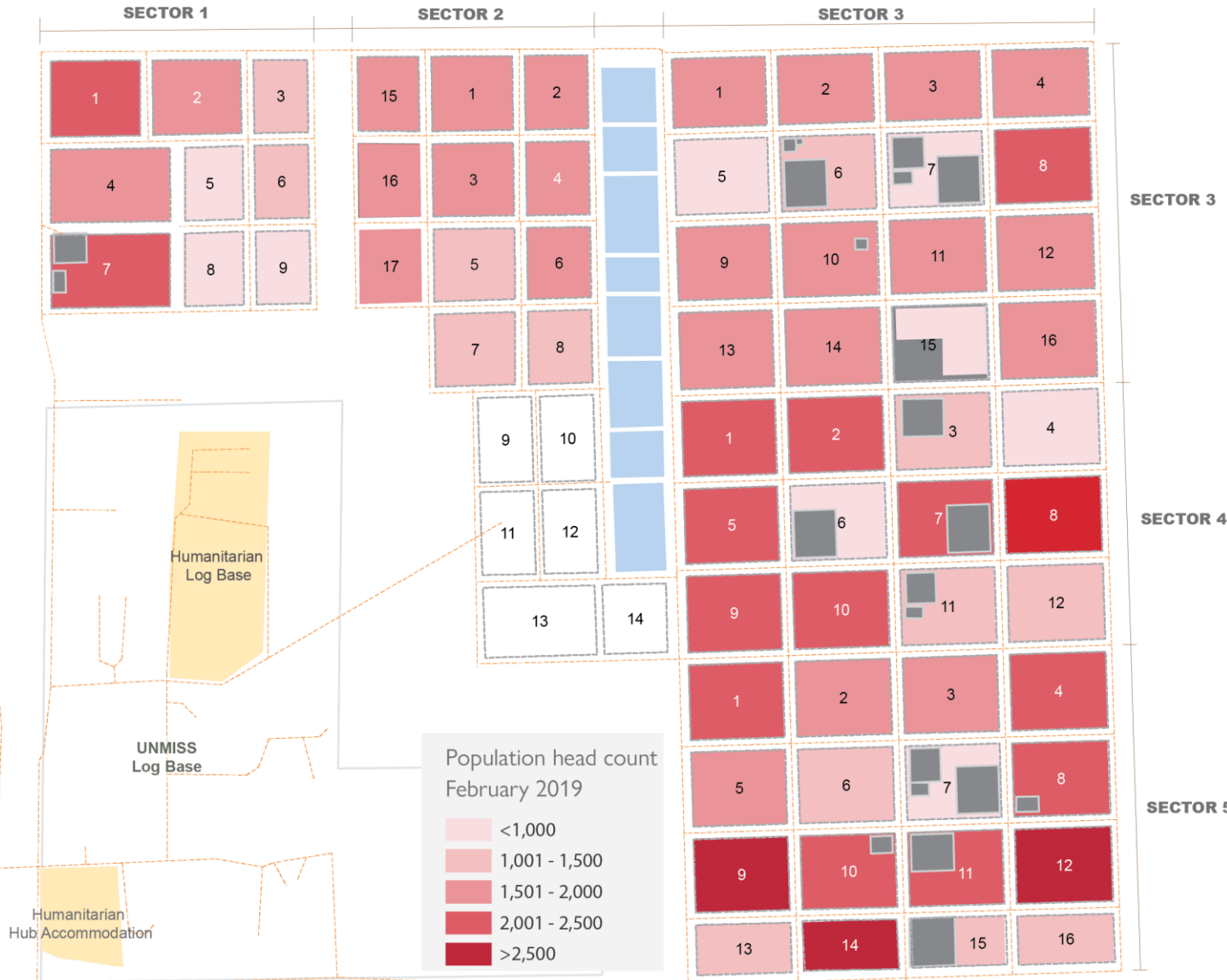
*Between the months of June to September, IOM was not able to conduct headcounts due to a CHC request to cease activities in the site

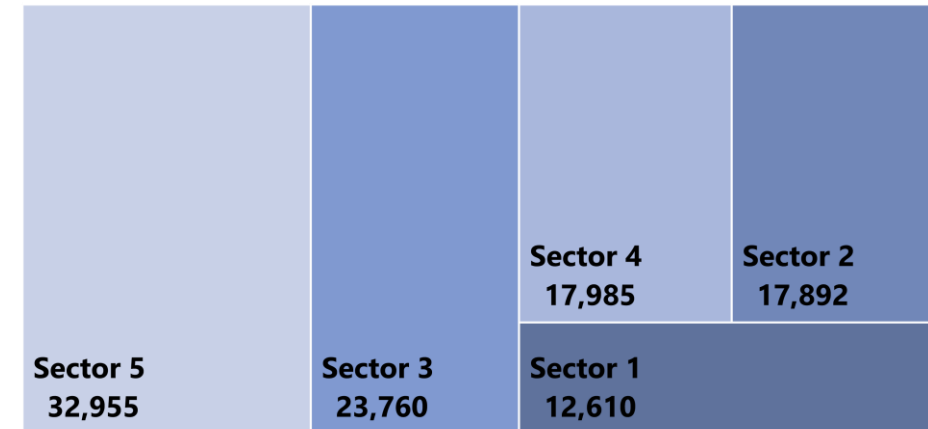

The most highly populated blocks in Sector 1 are Block 1 and 7, each with 2,084 and 2,401 individuals respectively. In Sector 2, Block 3, 15, 16 & 17 feature the highest population over 1,800 individuals. The highest numbers of individuals in Sector 3 are found in Block 8 (2,218 individuals) and Block 3 with just over 1,902 individuals. Sector 4 Block 8 host over 2,100 individuals. Sector 5 Block 12 and 14 feature with the highest population with 3,729 and 2,983 respectively.
