
SUMMARY OF EVENT



DISPLACED POPULATION:


4,400 Internally Displaced Persons, 915 Households (estimates)

- On 4 March 2021, with insecurity growing in Lac Province (due to the multiplication of attacks by Non-State Armed Groups), 730 households (3,650 individuals) preventively fled the villages of Bourboura, Torbo, Tchoukoukapi and Kangalia (Ngouboua souspréfecture, Kaya département) for the site of Baboul 2 (Baga-Sola sous-préfecture, Kaya département).
- On 10 March 2021, following abductions by Non-State Armed Groups which occurred on 4 March 2021 in the Bol sous-préfecture (Mamdi département), 185 households (750 individuals) preventively fled the villages of Ngualéa, Selia, Fidia, Koukoua and Ngalerom (located on the islands of Lake Chad) for the site of Marr located on the mainland (in the same sous-préfecture).
