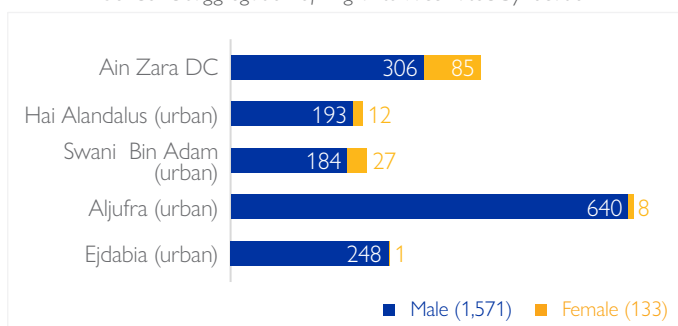


As part of the third phase of the Libyan national COVID-19 vaccination campaign led by the Libyan National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), IOM and NCDC conducted awareness raising sessions on COVID-19 vaccines with a total of 3,819 adult migrants (178 females and 3,641 males) in community settings in five municipalities.

Additionally, 1,704 (1,690 migrants and 14 Libyans) have received COVID-19 vaccination in community settings in three municipalities and Triq al Sikka DC during the reporting period (31 Jul - 6 Aug 2022).

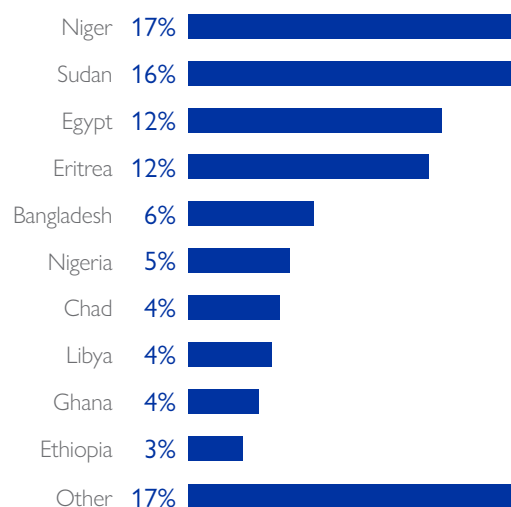
Gender disaggregation of migrants vaccinated by location



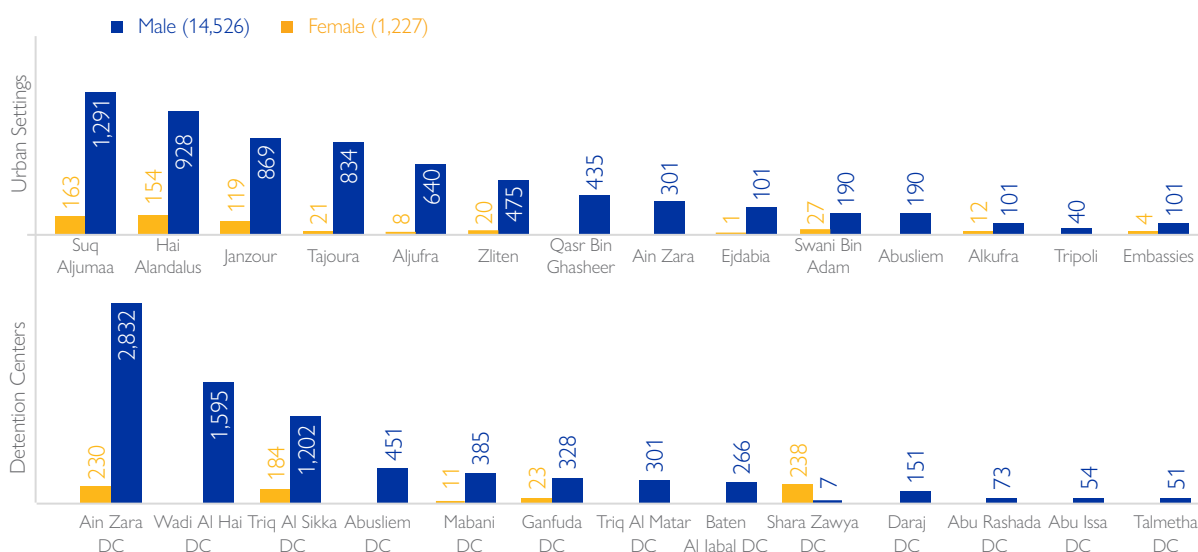

By 6 August 2022, the migrants vaccinated were from 40 different countries of origin, including Niger (17%), Sudan (16%) and Egypt (12%).

Country of origin disaggregation for migrants vaccinated



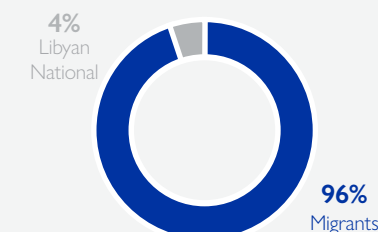
By 6 August 2022, a total of 15,753 persons (1,227 females and 14,526 males) including 15,109 migrants and 644 Libyans, have received either Sinopharm, AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines, out of which, 3,366 people (21%) have received two doses and 659 (5%) have received three doses. Vaccines were provided and administered by NCDC.



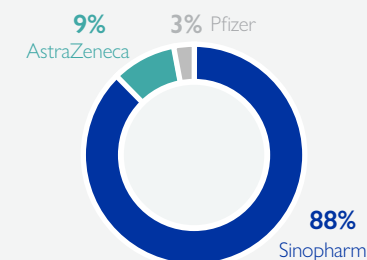
