

Within the period of 25 April - 05 May 2019, a total of 3,320 movements were recorded, including 2,695 arrivals and 625 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Chibok, Dikwa, Gwoza, Jere, Kaga, Mafa, Maiduguri, Mobbar, Monguno and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Borno state and locations in Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Mayo Belwa, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa state. Departures were recorded at Askira/Uba LGA of Borno state, Demsa, Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa state.

ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: voluntary relocation (27%), improved security (17%), fear of attack (7%), ongoing conflict (13%) military operation (4%)



Summary of major movements

Departures:

625 individuals

Gwoza: 441 arrivals were recorded in Gwoza LGA of Borno state. These include 31 arrivals from Darajamal and Shehuri ward of Bama LGA, 332 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon, 17 arrivals from Diffa in Niger Republic and 9 arrivals from Lamtari ward of Yola South LGA of Adamawa state. Other arrivals include 3 from Dure ward, 4 arrivals from Wakane ward, 2 arrivals from Chikede ward, 3 arrivals from Hambafa/Limaka ward and 1 arrival from Mbita ward all tracked at Pulka/Bokko and Bulabulin/Gwoza wards of Gwoza LGA. 85% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions, 3% due to military operation, 4% due to the ongoing conflict and 8% relocated voluntarily.

Bama: 353 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno state. These include 76 arrivals from Buduwa and Soye wards and were tracked at Shehuri ward of Bama LGA. 16 arrivals from GSSSS camp in Shehuri ward were also tracked at Banki IDP site in Baduwa ward of Bama LGA. Other arrivals include 29 from Rann ward of Kala-Balge LGA and 232 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon. 11% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to poor living conditions while 89% relocated voluntarily.

Jere: 351 arrivals were recorded in Jere LGA of Borno state. These include 104 arrivals from Rann ward of Kala-Balge LGA of Borno state, 53 arrivals from Diffa in Republic of Niger and 194 arrivals from Marwa in Cameroon. The new arrivals reported to have relocated due to the ongoing conflict.

Michika: 263 arrivals were recorded in Michika LGA of Adamawa state. These include 67 arrivals from Miniski Wuro Ngiki ward tracked at Michika ward of Michika LGA, 63 arrivals from Banshika ward of Hong LGA, 106 arrivals from Makama B and Bole/Yolde Pate wards of Yola south LGA and 27 arrivals from Zing A ward of Zing LGA of Adamawa state. 6% of the new arrivals reported to have relocated due to fear of attack while 94% relocated due to improved security.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

New Arrival Malnutrition Screening Summary (children 6-59 months)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and Oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by Nutrition Sector partners for 333 children of 6-59 months. Of the 333 children screened, the MUAC reading was: 11 children (3 from Inaccessible and 8 from accessible area) were in the Red category, 23 were in the Yellow category and 299 were measured in the Green category. No case of Oedema was reported in the 5 LGAs.

The results also include 170 children from neighbouring Cameroon and Republic of Niger (60 moved to Bama, 82 to Mobbar, and 28 to Ngala). Out of the 170 children measured, 6 children were in the red category, 149 were in the green category and 15 children were in the yellow category. All children found with severe acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. The data presented is not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
