The DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and to collect information on large and sudden population movements, provide frequent updates on the scale of displacement and quantify the affected population when needed. As a s ubcomponent of the Mobility Tracking methodology in Nigeria, ETT utilises direct observation and a broad network of key informants to capture best estimates of the affected population per location, enabling targeted humanitarian response planning.






Between 12 and 18 July 2021, a total of 5,860 movements were recorded in the states of Adamawa and Borno. The recorded movements consisted of 4,334 arrivals and 1,526 departures. Arrivals were recorded at locations in Askira/Uba, Bama, Biu, Gwoza, and Ngala Local Government Areas (LGAs) of the most conflict-affected state of Borno and in Fufore, Girei, Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Michika, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, Yola North, and Yola South LGAs of Adamawa.


Departures were recorded in Askira/Uba, Hawul, and Konduga LGAs of Borno, and Gombi, Hong, Lamurde, Madagali, Maiha, Mubi North, Mubi South, Numan, Song, and Yola North LGAs of Adamawa.


ETT assessments identified the following movement triggers: improved security (4,374 individuals or 75%), voluntary relocation (558 individuals or 9%), poor living conditions (470 individuals or 8%), seasonal farming (404 individuals or 7%) and military operations (31 individuals or 1%).

SUMMARY OF MAJOR MOVEMENTS

Hong: 2,900 arrivals and 36 departures were recorded in Hong LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 1,858 individuals from within Hong LGA in Adamawa State and 1,042 individuals from Gombi LGA in Adamawa State. All individuals who departed had Girei LGA in Adamawa State as their intended destination. Ninety-nine per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin and 1 per cent of the movements recorded were due to poor living conditions.

Gombi: 55 arrivals and 1,094 departures were recorded in Gombi LGA of Adamawa State. The arrivals included 43 individuals from Gwoza LGA in Borno State and 12 individuals from Yola North LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 1,042 individuals to Hong LGA in Adamawa State, 33 individuals to Girei LGA in Adamawa State and 19 individuals to Michika LGA in Adamawa State. Ninety-two per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin, 4 per cent were voluntary relocation and 4 per cent were due to seasonal farming.

Askira/Uba: 204 arrivals and 79 departures were recorded in Askira/Uba LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 111 individuals from within Askira/Uba LGA in Borno State, 54 individuals from Hawul LGA in Borno State, 26 individuals from Chibok LGA in Borno State and 13 individuals from Mubi North LGA in Adamawa State. The departures included 45 individuals to Song LGA in Adamawa State, 21 individuals to Gwoza LGA in Borno State and 13 individuals to Madagali LGA in Adamawa State. Eighty per cent of the movements recorded were a result of the improved security situation in areas of origin, 15 per cent were due to poor living conditions and 5 per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation.

Bama: 202 arrivals were recorded in Bama LGA of Borno State. The arrivals included 123 individuals from Marwa region in Cameroon and 79 individuals from within Bama LGA in Borno State. Sixty-one per cent of the movements recorded were voluntary relocation, 24 per cent of the movements were due to poor living conditions and 15 per cent of the movements recorded were due to military operations.

IOM's Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed in Nigeria's northeastern states. Only Local Government Areas (LGAs) in which the IDP population changed since the latest DTM round of assessments are represented in this report. The data has been collected by DTM staff deployed at the locations listed and cross-checked with the partners present on the ground.

NEW ARRIVAL MALNUTRITION SCREENING SUMMARY (CHILDREN 6-59 MONTHS)

An exhaustive nutrition screening using mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC) and oedema for acute malnutrition was conducted by sector partners for 87 children of 6-59 months. Of the 87 children screened, the MUAC reading indicated that 14 children were recorded in the red category, 8 children in the yellow category and 65 children in the green category. No case of oedema was reported in the 3 LGAs assessed.

The results also included 34 children who arrived from neighbouring countries (32 in Bama, and 2 in Gwoza). Of all the 34 children measured, 2 were recorded in the red category, 2 in the yellow category and the remaining 30 in the green category. All children found with acute malnutrition have been admitted for treatment. Please note, the data presented are not surveillance results and should be interpreted with caution.
