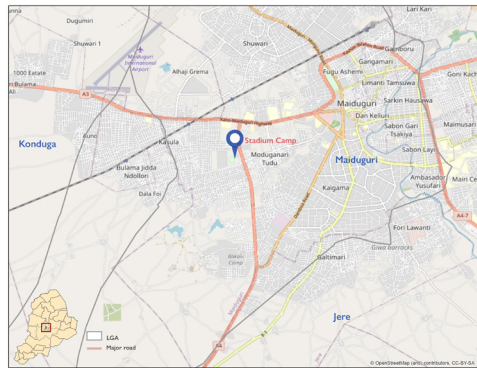




The Return Intention Survey in Stadium Camp was conducted at a household level between 1 and 3 December 2021. The camp is located in Maiduguri M.C. LGA, Borno State. A total of 255 households responded to the questionnaire, representing a sample of 10 per cent of the total IDP population. They were randomly selected from an estimated 2,478 households that are currently residing in Stadium Camp. All households reported that they were displaced as a result of the ongoing insurgency in North-east Nigeria.



LIVELIHOOD

Livelihoods in locations of origin

It is important to note that 97 per cent of respondents in Stadium Camp reported that their access to livelihood activities was interrupted as a result of their forced displacement. Eighty-five per cent of IDPs believe that they can resume their livelihood activities upon return to their locations of origin.

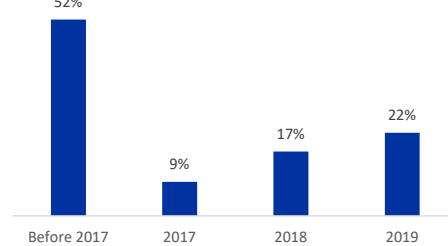
DISPLACEMENT HISTORY

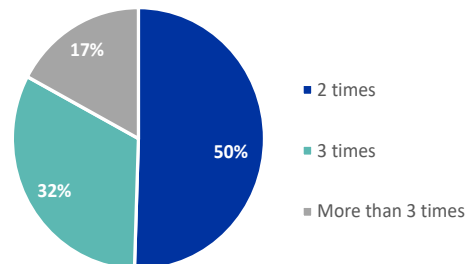

Year of displacement



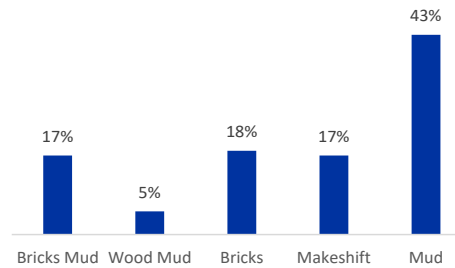
The graphic above demonstrates that a significant number of IDPs in Stadium Camp find themselves in a situation of protracted displacement. Contrary to other camps around Maiduguri, Stadium Camp hosts a significant share of IDPs displaced in 2018 and 2019.

Number of times displaced

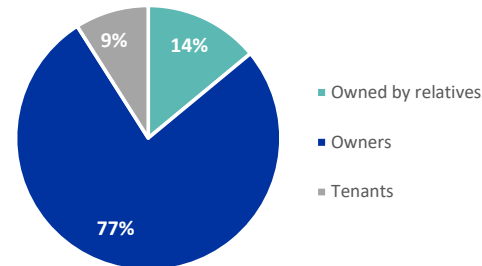

The analysis illustrates that a majority of 72 per cent of the IDPs in Stadium Camp are planning on returning to their locations of origin following the Government relocation schemes. As 97 per cent of IDPs in Stadium Camp originate from Kukawa LGA, a great influx is to be expected in that specific LGA as a result of the closure of Stadium Camp. It is to be noted that 27 per cent of IDPs do not intend to return to their locations of origin but rather prefer to integrate in the local community around Stadium Camp. This choice is mainly motivated by the security situation in the LGAs of origin.
