

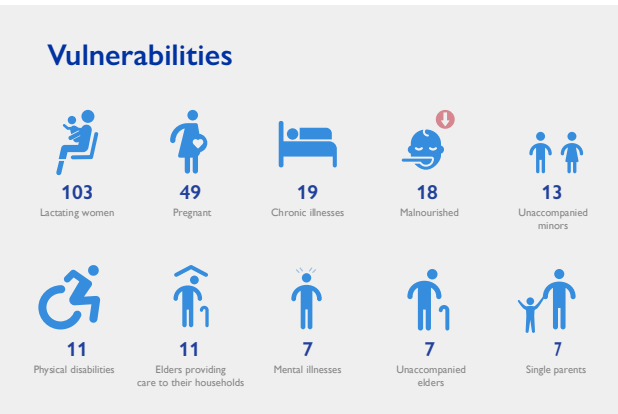
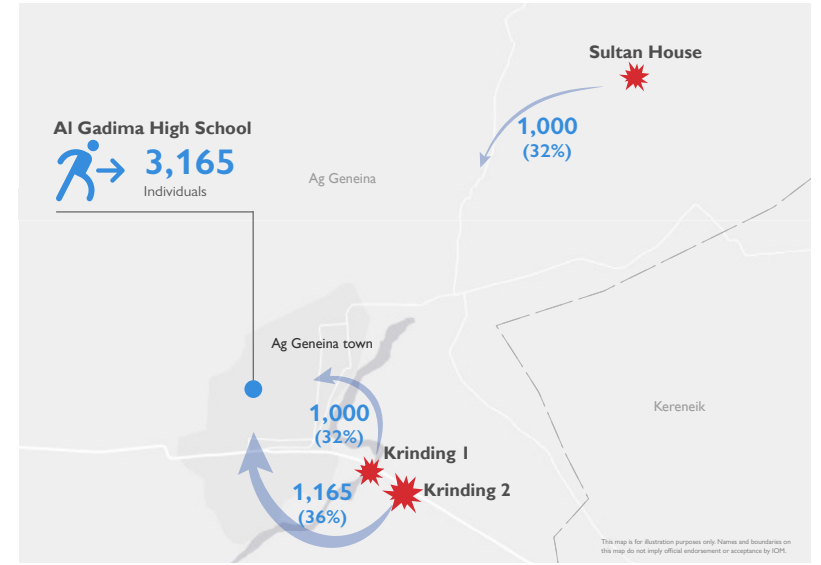
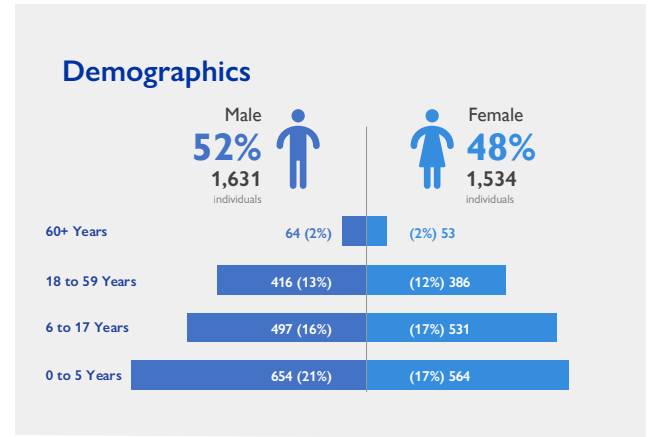
AG GENEINA, WEST DARFUR – SITE PROFILE

Al Gadima High School, Ag Geneina Locality Office and Al Farouq School

EVENT OVERVIEW: DTM teams activated Emergency Event Tracking (EET) to monitor the displacement of individuals affected by inter-communal conflict between Masalit and Arab tribes. Clashes erupted on 16 January 2021 in the Krinding area of Ag Geneina town, West Darfur. For more information, please see **EET_Ag Geneina, West Darfur 005**. Based on information needs identified by the Inter Sector Coordination Group (ISCG), data consolidated under DTM's fifth EET update has been further disaggregated to produce the following three site profiles for subsequent humanitarian response planning and design.

AL GADIMA HIGH SCHOOL

The fifth EET update estimates a total number of 3,165 displaced individuals (958 households) seeking shelter in Al Gadima high school. All individuals are Sudanese nationals. DTM teams report at least 245 individuals to have additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support. Reports further identify that 10 individuals have been killed and nine sustained injuries, whilst at least 527 internally displaced persons (IDPs) have lost personal belongings and livestock. Based on a ranking scale, the three main priority needs are food, non-food items and WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene).

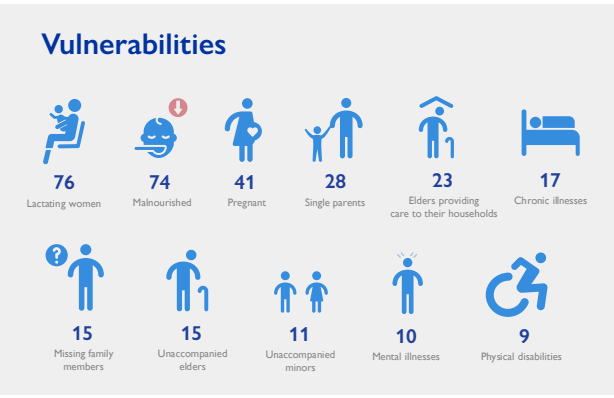
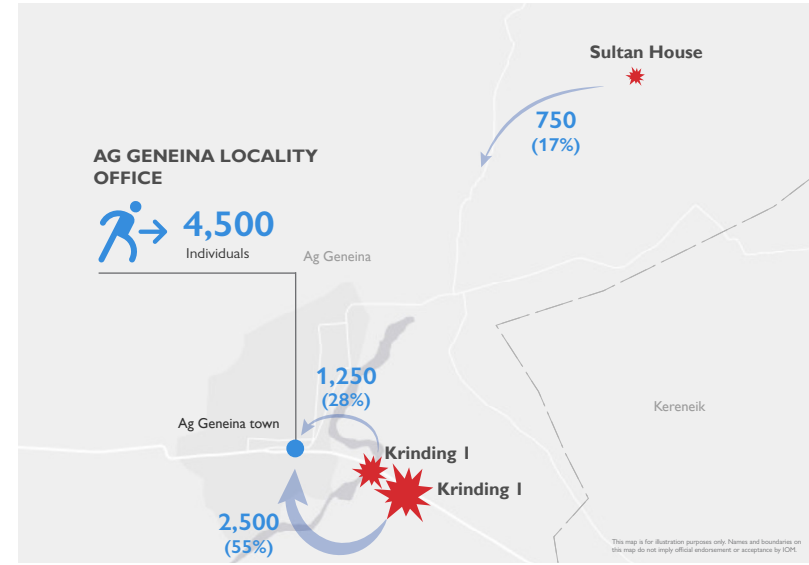
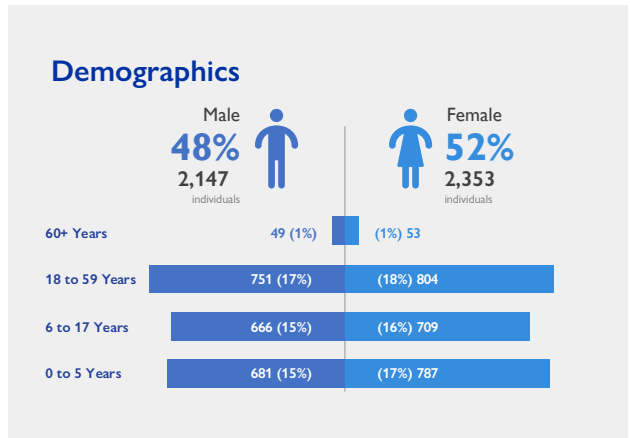

Al Gadima High School, **Ag Geneina Locality Office** and Al Farouq School

AG GENEINA LOCALITY OFFICE

The fifth EET update estimates a total number of 4,500 individuals (900 households) seeking shelter in Ag Geneina locality office. All individuals are Sudanese nationals. DTM teams report at least 319 individuals to have additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support. Reports further identify that 14 individuals have been killed and 27 sustained injuries, whilst at least 900 IDPs have lost personal belongings and livestock. Based on a ranking scale, the three main priority needs in Ag Geneina locality office are food, non-food items and WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene).

Al Gadima High School, Ag Geneina Locality Office and Al Farouq High School

AL FAROUQ HIGH SCHOOL

The fifth EET update estimates a total number of 1,260 displaced individuals (252 households) seeking shelter in Al Farouq high school. All individuals are Sudanese nationals. DTM teams report at least 175 individuals to have additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support. Reports further identify that six individuals have been killed and nine sustained injuries, whilst at least 77 IDPs have lost personal belongings and livestock. Based on a ranking scale, the three main priority needs in Al Farouq high school are food, non-food items and WASH (water, sanitation, and hygiene).
