

## STRANDED MIGRANTS IN DJIBOUTI AS OF 26 NOVEMBER 2020



Following the border closure in Ethiopia and due to the stricter border management policies in Yemen, some of the migrants who were transiting through Djibouti on their way to or from the Arabian Peninsula found themselves stranded in the country. These migrants live in spontaneous sites located along the migration corridor.

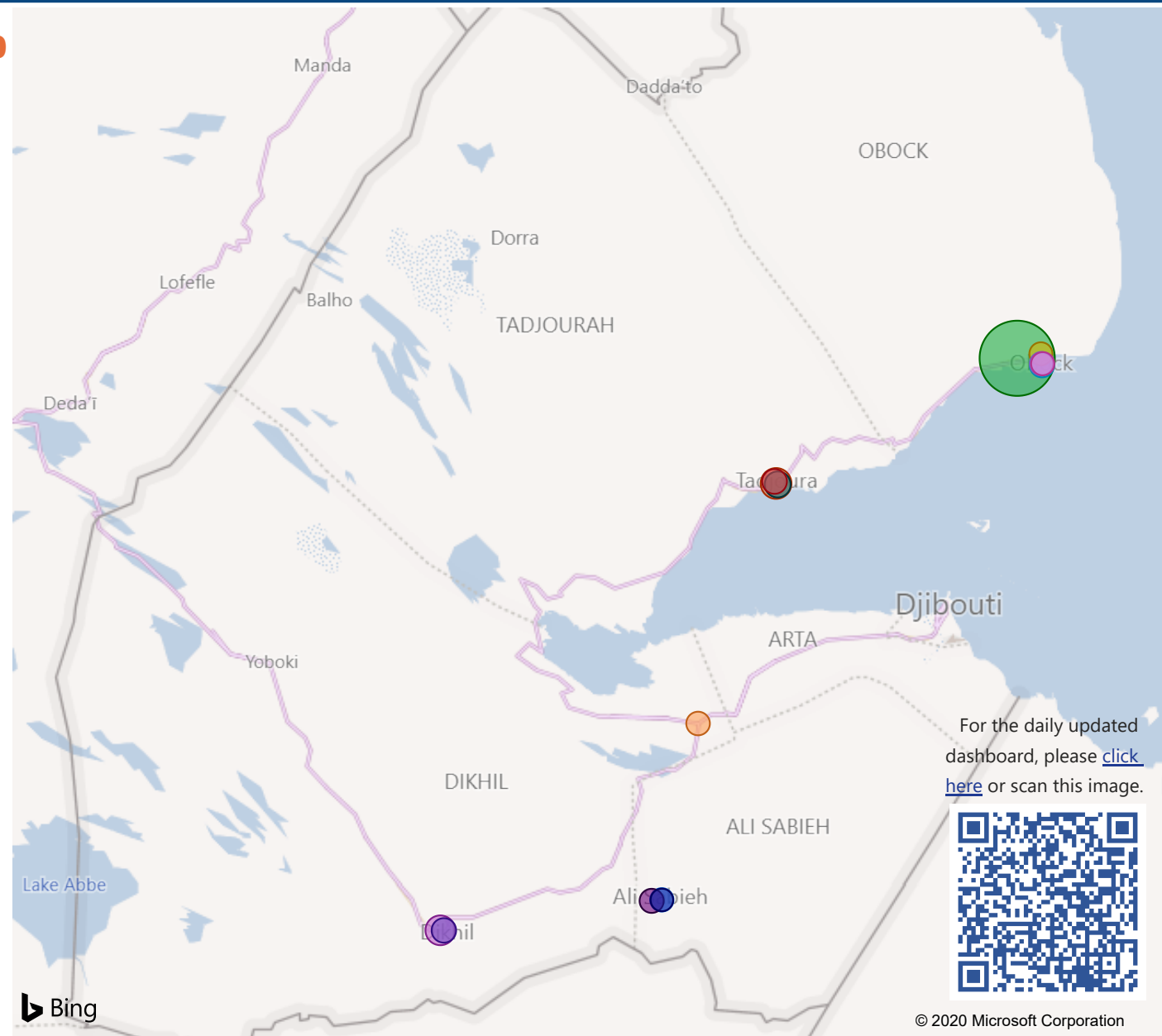
The Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM), through its field enumerator teams and key informants, collects data on a daily basis at migrant sites across the country.

All reported migrants are Ethiopian nationals.

*NOTE: This data does not include Djibouti City. Since the closure of the Massagara site on 14 October 2020, new migrants arriving from Yemen are hosted in the Migration Response Center (MRC) in Obock.*

### RETURNS FROM YEMEN BETWEEN 1 AND 26 NOVEMBER 2020

From 1 to 26 November 2020, 897 migrants from Yemen (36 female and 861 male) arrived at Obock coast. Since May 2020, a total of 5,180 migrants (691 female and 4,489 male) returning from Yemen have been recorded mainly between Moulhoule and Ras Bir.
