



DTM Rapid Response Assessments are deployed following the flagging of incidents in order to assess the displacement impacts on affected populations and report back to the Humanitarian Country Team. Results are considered preliminary until confirmed in the following IDP/Returnee report. For all reports and datasets please see DTM Libya website at www.globaldtm.info/libya.

Clashes around Tamnhnt airport base began in early April 2017 and have been ongoing until the time of publication. DTM conducted a rapid assessment in the affected areas to determine the impact of the clashes on populations residing in the area.

According to preliminary results, a total of 350 individuals (approximately 70 households) left their homes in the airbase where they had been stationed. They went to other baladiyas in the South including Brak, Sebha, Algurdha Ashshati, Alsharguiya, and Algatroun. Approximately 15 individuals (3 households) remained in Albawanees baladiya.



Main Reported Needs

- NFI** Main reported needs are NFIs, food and medical services and shelter.
- The issues related to these needs are their high cost for IDPs.
- Lack of security continues to be an issue hindering the movement of individuals in Albawanees.

Shelter Settings

The majority of those who left Tamnhnt are reported to be living in their previous home, in rented accommodation, or hosted with relatives.
