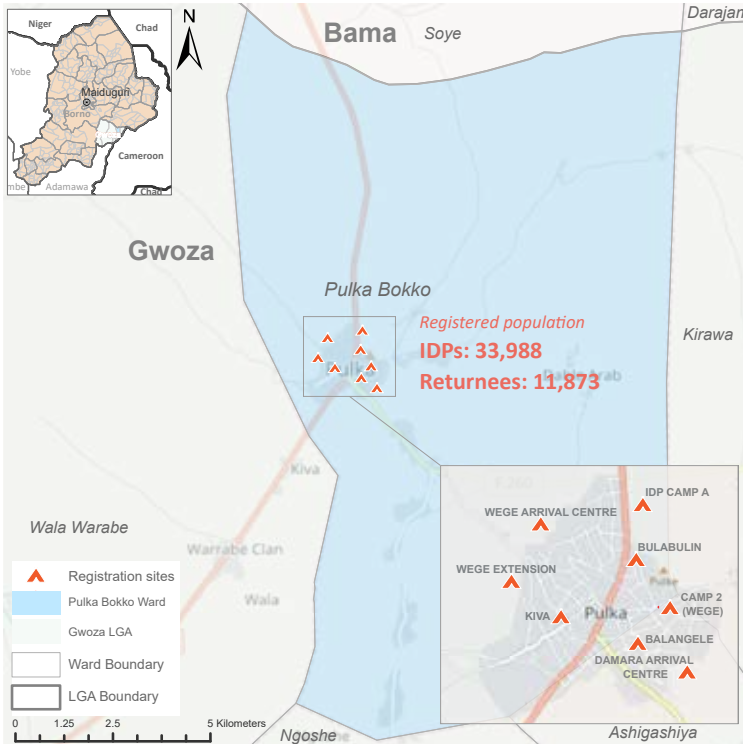
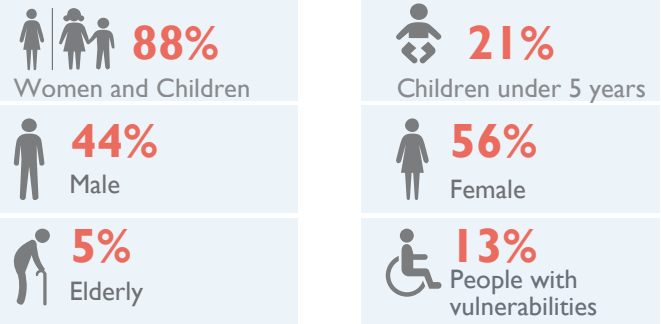


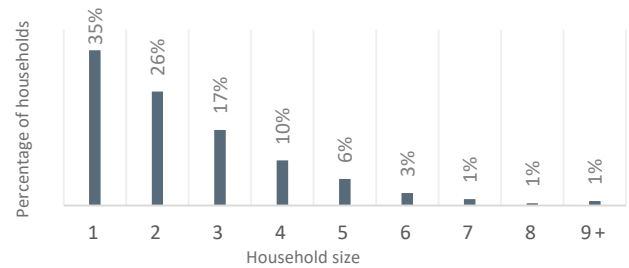
## Biometric Registration Update | 9 May 2018

### Household size distribution



Recently concluded Biometric Registration of over 5,000 new arrivals in Pulka/Bokko ward of Gwoza Local Government Area (LGA), within the period of 22 February–22 April 2018, has brought the total number of displaced persons and returnees in Pulka to 45,861 individuals (10,297 households). The average family size within the location is 2.5, with 61 per cent of families comprising of 1-2 members; 27 per cent comprising of 3-4 members; 9 per cent comprising of 5-6 members; 2 per cent comprising of 7-8 members; and 1 per cent comprising of 9 or more family members. Seventy four per cent of the registered population are IDPs, while twenty six per cent are returnees.

During the registration exercise, the enumerators collected vulnerability data to identify individuals who may require additional humanitarian assistance. Out of the total population registered, 13 per cent are experiencing at least one of the vulnerabilities (shown below). Vulnerability figures are obtained through interviews with heads of households, in the presence of other family members.

Sixty six per cent of the people registered in Pulka originate from the town, 34 per cent were from other surrounding wards in Gwoza LGA, 4 per cent were originally from Bama LGA and 3 per cent have been displaced from other LGAs.
